FRUIT TREES & OTHER EDIBLES

Apples, plums, & highbush blueberries need 2 varieties for pollination!! It is recommended for pears.

- 0170 apple: Cortland \$22** 3½-6', ME Z4-5 Medium sized ribbed, dull red fruit with purple blush.. A good eating or cooking that blooms midseason and ripens late in fall.
- 0216 apple: Duchess of Oldenburg \$22** 3½-6' ME Z3-4 Medium-sized round red striped with crisp tender flesh. Small to medium tree. Blooms midseason. Very hardy. Ripens late summer.
- 0386 apple: Honeycrisp \$23** 3½-6' ME Z3-4 Mottled striped red over yellow. Described as "explosively crisp". Annual bearing w/ harvest in early fall through October. This is one of the new favorites. You may have tried it at the Ag Trade Show.
- 1017 apple: Sweet 16 \$22** 3½-6' ME Z3-6 Bronze-red medium sized fruit. Very hardy. Keeps until mid winter. Blooms midseason.
- 1492 pear: Columbia \$22** 3½ to 6', ME Z4 A fall pear best for canning and sauces. Large tree produces heavily every other year. Looks like a Bartlett.
- 1602 pear: Seckel \$22** 3½ to 6', ME Z4 Late summer fruit. Small yellowish brown has very reliable fruit. Very productive annual producer.
- 1910 cherry: Stella Sweet \$22** 3½-6', Z4-5 Self pollinating large black-skinned fruit. Expected hardy in central Maine.
- 1933 pie cherry: Mesabi \$22** 3½-6' ME Z3-4 Sweeter than most pie cherries. Ripens in mid-summer. Very hardy and productive.
- 2010 peach: Reliance \$22** 3½-6' Z4-5 to the cold side. Considered the hardiest peach. Bright yellow flesh. Bears large crops at an early age. This is the type that had such heavy crops in the past few years.
- 2057 hybrid plum: Kaga \$22** 3½ - 6', ME Z3 Good fruit about 1" and heavy bloomer. Good pollinator for other hybrids. Mid to late-summer fruit. Grows to about 10'.
- 2260 blueberries: Lowbush \$10** ME Z2 Considered by many the only "true" blueberry. Woodsy dry poor acid soil is needed. Also a good ground cover. 2 yr. transplants. **Bfr Dry**
- 2300 blueberries: Earliblue \$12** 12-30", ME Z4 Large to medium blue berries in loose clusters. First to ripen on vigorous plants.
- 2335 blueberries: Patriot \$12** 12-30", Z3 Large firm berries grow on upright open 4'bush. Partial lowbush parentage. Adaptable to many soils.
- 2458 grape: La Crescent \$10** 1-2 yr vines Z3 Clusters of yellow-green fruit for white wine. Extremely hardy and vigorous plant.
- 2480 grape: Prairie Star (white) \$10** 1-2 yr vines Z3-4 Medium sized white clusters of fruit. Very hardy.
- 2606 raspberry: Polana bndl of 10/\$20** Z4-5 Very early everbearing ripens in late August to September. Short canes.
- 2685 raspberry: Nova bndl of 10/\$20** Z3 Mid season with med sized bright red fruit.
- 2731 blackberry: Borderland Beauty bndl of 3/\$16** ME Z3 Very hardy abundant fruit on 6-7' canes.
- 2780 strawberry: Jewel bndl of 50/\$13.50** Z4 Large bright red sweet berry that holds its size all season.
- 2787 strawberry: Sparkle bndl of 50/\$13.50** Z3 Very sweet smaller berries. Blooms later to avoid frost.
- 2860 horseradish: Bigtop bndl of 5/\$15** Z4 Newer strain with disease resistance. Roots harvested in fall.
- 2875 asparagus: Purple Passion bndl of 25/\$15** ME Z2 Early with large purple stalks & white interior. Tender stalks.
- 2892 Stevens American Cranberry bndl of 10/\$17** ME Z2 Large deep red fruit on vigorous vines. Require light acid soil. One clump will fill 5' x 5' bed. **wid Bfr**
- 2938 Juneberry \$14** 2-4' ME Z2 Grows 6-12' Canadian Shadberry is a compact shrub. Excellent foliage & berry production. Large fragrant white flowers in early spring. Prefers slightly acidic soils, tolerates partial shade, salt, pollution; not standing water. **wid Bfr**
- 3000 Golden Glory cornelian cherry \$15** 1½-3' ME Z4-5 Bright red fruit on 15-20' tree. **wid**
- 3034 hops: Willamette pkg of 3/\$15** Z4-5 Spicy aromatic with low bittering value. Needs well drained soil.
- 3076 Joel Bush Cherry \$15** 1-3' ME Z3 Bush cherry grows to 4'. Pink blossoms, self-pollinating and ripens in September. **wid**
- 3171 sweet elderberry: Goodbarn \$14.50** 12-14", ME Z3 Large flat creamy-white clusters in early summer. Large clusters of fruit. Very hardy. See below for 2nd variety needed for pollination. **wid Bfr**
- 3179 sweet elderberry: Johns \$14.50** 12-15", ME Z3 Vigorous up to 10' tall with large berries and fruit clusters. **wid Bfr**

Note symbols to help select wildlife and buffer plants more easily.

- 3238 Regal lingonberry \$11** Vigorous spreading groundcover with bright red fruit. Similar conditions as low bush blueberries. **Wld**
- 3245 Highbush Cranberry: Wentworth \$10** 6-18" ME Z2 White flowers in May. Red-orange berries in late summer. Good bird food but also used for preserves. Bright lime green leaves. Plant grows to 8-12'. Prefers rich well drained soils. **Wld**

EVERGREEN & DECIDUOUS SHADE TREES

- 3270 Balsam Fir bndl of 5/ \$14** 6-12", ME Z3 The fragrant branches and needles of this tree are used in wreaths, balsam pillows and potpourri. Grows 45 - 75' ; prefers well-drained, moist acid soils. Avoid roadside planting.
- 3360 Russian Arborvitae (single tree) 1/\$14** 12-18" ME Z3 Groundcover with bright green dense foliage. Hardy. Prefers moist well-drained soils. Called Carpet Cypress. **Bfr**
- 3400 Norway Spruce bndl of 5/\$14 ME Z2** Fast growing to 80'. Wide-spreading upright with graceful long branches that often reach to the ground. Showy 4-6" cones.
- 3485 Korean Stone Pine (single tree) 1/\$8** 9-12", ME Z3-4 Loose branchy upright form grows to 40'. Dark blue-green needles. Slow growing. Seed is reported to be edible but takes a few years.
- 3590 Arborvitae (E. White Cedar) bndl of 5/\$14** 9-15", ME Z2 This narrow tree grows 20'- 60'. Arborvitae thrives in rich moist & marshy soils. Good for screens & hedges but very slow growing and deer like it. **Bfr**
- 3716 Northern Pecan \$12** 18-24", ME Z4 Grows to 70'. Likes clay or sandy soil with organic materials. Hardy this far north but may need warm fall to fill nuts. Once taproots get established it should grow quickly.
- 3799 Precocious Hazelnut \$18** 2-3', ME Z4 Vigorous suckering plant grows to 12'. Need 2 for pollination. Takes 3-4 years for nuts. **Wld**
- 3990 Sugar Maple \$14** 4-6', ME Z3 Largest of the maples native to Maine, and is valued for its shade, syrup and lumber. Shade tolerant. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Sensitive to salt and air pollutions, not a good city tree.
- 4009 Sweet Birch \$16** 3-5', ME Z4 irregular wide-crowned tree grows to 70'. Reddish-brown to black bark with golden yellow foliage in fall. **Bfr**
- 4014 Heritage River Birch (clump of 3) \$22** 18-28", ME Z4 Clump of 3 for distinctive planting of spreading trees with attractive peeling bark. Does not like alkaline soils. Fast growing. **Bfr Wt**
- 4053 American Yellowwood \$14** 18-24" ME Z4 Grows to 50' with dense canopy. Fragrant white racemes attract bees. Prefers well-drained soils and is ph adaptable. **Wld**
- 4145 White Oak \$14** 2-4', ME Z3 Grows to 80'. Slow growing very large and broad tree. Bottom branches grow horizontal. **Wld**
- 4190 Cape Rosier Willow \$12** 3-4', ME Z4 Grows to 50'. Trees develop a gnarly head with great character. Long whips for basket making. Prefers moist soils and sun. **Bfr Wt**
- 4191 Britzensis Coral Bark Willow \$10** 2-3', ME Z2 Fast growing, shrubby with "coral-red" bark. Likes water. This is a great winter plant in the snowy landscape. **Bfr Wt**
- 4207 Littleleaf Linden \$13** 24-30", Z3 All round shade tree grows to 60'. Fragrant yellow flowers attract bees. Not as large as the America Linden/Basswood. **Wld**
- 4240 Redbud \$18** 2-3', Z4 Clusters of purple-pink pea-sized flowers in early spring on irregular shaped tree that even has trunk even with pink undertones. Large heart shaped leaves turn to yellow fall color. Likes sun or partial shade. Grows to 30'.
- 4250 White Fringetree \$16** 18-24", ME Z3 Large multi-stemmed shrub to 30' Covered with white lacey fragrant flowers in spring. Nice in groups. Likes moist fertile, acid soil but adaptable. Good city plant.
- 4255 Pagoda Dogwood \$13** 6-24", ME Z3 Small tree with tiers of multi-stemmed branches. Fragrant white 2-3" flower clusters in late spring. In midsummer the immature olive berries ripen to dark blue. Fairly tolerant of sun and soil conditions. **Bfr**
- 4341 Seven-son Flower \$15** 8-10", ME Z4 Small showy multi-stemmed large shrub grows to 10-15'. Fragrant, small white flowers in late summer which turn pink and contrast with green foliage.

SHRUBS

- 4628 flowering crab: Indian Magic \$22** 3½-6', ME Z4 Red buds open midseason to single flower with small red fruits. Tree grows to 15' x 15'. **Wld**
- 4691 flowering crab: Niedzwetzkyana \$22** 3½-6', ME Z4 Red flowers with 2" red fruit. This is a larger crabapple than most. **Wld**
- 4731 flowering crab: Prairie Rose \$22** 3½-6', ME Z4 Pink buds to large light pink flowers and strong fragrance. Blooms late into the season. Very small hard fruit.
- 4797 flowering crab: Red – semi-weeping \$22** 3½-6', ME Z4 Reddish buds turn to pink flowers and then white. Smaller tree, 10 x 14' with good yellow fall foliage. **Wld**
- 4927 Fragrant Abelia \$12** 12-16" ME Z4 Showy fragrant pink tubular white centered flowers. Best as a specimen

or hedge planting. Blooms in late spring. As fragrant as hyacinth. Glossy green foliage turns orange red in fall. Full sun to partial shade. Prune after flowering. **Wid**

- 4945 Bearberry \$8** well rooted transplants, Z2 Called Bear's Grape. Low growing delicate glossy evergreen groundcover. Small white flowers in spring with berries much later. Tolerant but tough to transplant. **Wid Bfr**
- 4961 Red Chokeberry \$9** 12-30", ME Z4 Upright multi-stemmed form makes a good landscape shrub. Small white flowers in clusters. Dark green foliage turns crimson in fall. Grows to 6-10'. **Wid Bfr**
- 4968 Black Chokeberry \$9** 12-30" ME Z3 Compact rounded form. White blooms in late spring. Green foliage turns to wine-red foliage in fall. Produces black berries. Grows to 4-6' and is adaptable to location. **Wid Bfr**
- 4997 Miss Ruby Butterfly Bush \$10** 16-20", ME Z4-5 Pink fragrant blooms from mid-summer to fall. Compact upright habit grows to 4-5'. **Wid**
- 5049 Buttonbush \$10** 24-36", ME Z4 Loose rounded branchy shrub that likes it moist. Very interesting round "flowers" that generate seeds eaten by birds in the fall. Mine finally bloomed in '06' and were fascinating and long lasting. **Wid Bfr**
- 5127 Red Vein Enkianthus \$12** 12-18" ME Z4 Narrow shrub with yellow bell-shaped flowers in mid-late spring. Tough, slow growing plant. Flowers are incredible up close. Grows to 10'.
- 5142 forsythia; Northern Gold \$12** 9-18" ME Z3 Tough plant, so it blooms above the snow line. Golden-yellow flowers on 6-8' plant. **Bfr**
- 5172 hydrangea: Endless Summer \$16** Z4 In acidic soils this is the blue flowering variety blooms on old and new wood. Grows to 3-4'.
- 5189 winterberry: Red Sprite \$11** 6-12", ME Z4 3-4' dense compact female holly. Profuse red berries keep color all winter. Excellent for wildlife. Prefers wet soils but will tolerate dry conditions. A great buffer! See male pollinator next. **Wid Bfr wet**
- 5193 winterberry: Jim Dandy \$10** 6-12", ME Z4 Male selection to pollinate female winterberry. Grows to 4-5'. **Bfr wet**
- 5210 Beautybush \$12** 2-3', ME Z4 Fast growing multi-stemmed shrub needs room to grow. Small pink trumpet-like flowers in June. **Bfr**
- 5215 Spicebush \$12** 9-12", ME Z4 Large, rounded, multi-stemmed native flowering shrub with lemony-spicy scent. **Wid**
- 5240 Bayberry \$12** 12-24", ME Z2-3 Rounded semi-evergreen and salt-tolerant. Adaptable to various soils. Good mass planting. Common on the coast. Unsexed plants. Grows to 5-9'. Good wildlife and buffer plant. **Wid Bfr**
- 5306 Mango Tango Potentilla \$10** 18-24" ME Z2 Tricolor orange, red and yellow blooms on tough plant that is 2' tall.
- 5350 Rosa Rugosa/Beach Rose bndl of 3/\$16.50** 2-3' 2 yr. transplants, ME Z2 Vigorous spreading shrub, 4-6' tall. Fragrant flowers result in large red edible rose hips. Prune to control size. Likes full sun and drained soil but is tolerant. **Bfr**
- 5533 The Fairy rose \$12** ME Z4 Double pastel pink flowers that bloom all summer. Low growing to 2'. Tolerant of poor soils and neglect. My type of rose.
- 5568 Black Pussy Willow \$10** 12-15", ME Z4 Great wetland plant with distinctive purple, almost black catkins in early spring. The flowers don't even look real they are so dark. **Bfr Wt**
- 5577 Blue Leaf Arctic Willow \$10** 9-12", ME Z3 Medium sized spreading shrub with tiny blue foliage. Prune to keep small. **Bfr Wt**
- 5676 spirea: Neon Flash \$13** 8-10" ME Z4 Reddish-hot pink blooms throughout mid-summer. Attracts butterflies, bees and birds on compact 3-4' plant. **Wid Bfr**
- 5723 Coralberry \$11** 12-22", ME Z4 Low growing, arching shrub grows 3-5' tall. Purplish-green flowers in early summer are followed by purple-red berries that last until winter. **Wid**
- 5766 lilac: Vesper's Song \$14** 2-3 yr plants, ME Z3 Single, dark, violet fragrant blooms. Blooms a bit later and grows to 9'.
- 5777 lilac: Miss Kim \$14** 2-3 yr plants ME Z3 Small, single lavender blooms are heavily scented and appear late. Compact and only grows to 8'.
- 5918 Korean Spicebush \$13** 9-15" Z4 Very early bloom and clove-like scent in spring. Cherry buds open to white flowers. Prune after flowering.
- 5921 viburnum: Witherod/Appalachian Tea \$13** 9-12", Z3 Dense, rounded native shrub with white flowers from late spring into early summer. Multi-colored fruit clusters. A very rugged multi-use shrub grows to 5-6'. **Wid Bfr**

OTHER PLANTS

- 6042 begonia: Dark Red pkg of 4//\$13** tender summer bulb Velvety flowers bloom all summer. Excellent bedding/ container plants. Best in cool filtered sunlight & air circulation. Love moist but not soggy soil. Pinch back for more blooms.
- Sword Lily Blue Tropic Glad Mix pkg of 10/\$5** tender summer bulb. Deep lavender. Best with 3-4 hours of direct sun per day but will tolerate full sun to light shade. Plant 3-4" deep.
- 6121 Sword Lily Mon Amour Glad Mix pkg of 10/\$5** tender summer bulb. Pastel.
- 6171 White Prosperity Gladiola Mix pkg of 10/\$5** tender summer bulb Bright white ruffled blooms.
- 6252 columbine: Black Currant pkg of 3/\$10** Z3 Supposed to be a naturally dwarf [6-12" tall] variety that is bushy and a distinctive new color.

- 6282 Butterfly Weed pkg of 3/\$12** Z4 Tangerine flowers in midsummer to fall. May be difficult to establish but worth it. **Wld**
- 6302 aster; October Skies pkg of 3/\$12** Z4 Lavender flowers only growing 15-18" tall in a mound of aromatic foliage.
- 6322 astilbe: Visions pkg of 3/\$8** Z4 Raspberry-red plumes with fragrance. Drought-tolerant variety grows to 14-16".
- 6402 bleeding heart; White Alba pkg of 3/\$9** Z3 White heart-shaped flowers instead of the pink. Grows to 30-36". **Bfr**
- 6422 digitalis: Carillon Foxglove pkg of 3/\$12** Z3 Low-growing true perennial with creamy yellow flowers. **Bfr**
- 6442 fern: Japanese Painted pkg of 2/\$11** Z3 Decorative but rugged fern. Soft grey-green with wine-red veins. Gets 8-18". **Bfr**
- 6472 fern: Ostrich pkg of 3/\$12** Z2 Bright green with curled frond tips. Grows 3-7. Spreads through runners. Tolerates sun if swampy. **Bfr**
- 6501 cranesbill: Brookside single plant/\$5** Z4 Blue flowers with creamy white centers. Turns red-orange in autumn in 20-24" mounds of foliage.
- Daylily** Z2-3 early blooms to midseason **Bfr**
- **6572 Twist of Lemon pkg of 3/\$12** ME Z2 Narrow lemon-yellow with orange-yellow throat. Very vigorous. 36-40"
- **6562 Red Volunteer pkg of 3/\$12** ME Z2 Red-maroon with orange-yellow throat. 30-36".
- 6582 Lord Baltimore rose mallow pkg of 2/\$11** Z4 Deep red plate-sized hibiscus flowers grow to 4-5'.
- Hosta** Z3 Bold foliage will grow in mounds or clumps. Flowers appear on tall stalks. **Bfr**
- **6612 August Moon pkg of 3/\$11** Large rounded leaves with white flowers. 20-32" tall.
- **6632 Halcyon pkg of 3/\$11** Mid-sized blue with glue-green leaves. Will become very wide but only 20-24" tall.
- 6672 lavender: Munstead pkg of 3/\$12** 12-18", Z4 Lavender-blue spires with 15-18" spires. Spreading, aromatic likes full sun & good drainage.
- 6761 bee balm: Beauty of Cobham pkg of 1/\$5** Z3 Pale pink flowers on purple bracts brows in mounds to 36" tall. Bees and butterflies love them. **wld**
- 6791 Catmint pkg. of 3/\$10** Z3 Long stems with lavender-blue flowers. It isn't just the cat who likes the smell. Grows 2-3' tall.
- 6851 peony Japanese Tree pkg of 1/\$19** Z4 Large burgundy blooms with yellow stamens grows on 4-5' plants. May take 2-3 years to bloom.
- 6901 phlox: Laura garden pkg of 1/\$4.00** Z3 Fuchsia-purple flowers with white center that only gets 24-30" tall. May keep blooming into late summer.
- 6921 Balloon Flower pkg of 1/\$4.50** Z4 Buds swell like balloons before they bust into bell-like single violet-blue flowers. Good for cutting. One of the last perennials to emerge in spring so be careful not to disrupt or plant over Z3.
- 6962 Blue speedwell pkg of 3/\$9** Z3 Blue flowers from early summer to autumn. Multiple erect flower spikes. Plant forms a clump and is good border plant.
- 7032 Purple Coneflower pkg of 2/\$13** ME Z3 certified organic Flowers attract butterflies and helpful insects. Vigorous 30-48" plant likes full sun and sandy loam. **wld**
- 7041 Hyssop pkg of 1/\$7** ME Z3 Blue-violet flowers bloom all summer. Thrives in poor dry soil. 12-20".
- 7052 Elecampane pkg of 2/10** ME Yellow daisy-type flowers on plant up to 8' tall. Will draw beneficial insects. **wld**
- 7510 Agri-gel ½ oz. packet \$3** Crystals adhere to plant roots, absorb and hold water, reducing transplant shock. Non-toxic. Single packet mixed with water will treat up to 100 cane plants or 50 trees and shrubs.

The Kennebec and Somerset County Soil & Water Conservation Districts combined sale allows you to pick your order up at different locations. **Please make it clear what location you want to use for picking up your order, so your plants are at the right one.** Select the location that

works best for you. Questions? Contact either of the districts. You may send or drop off your order form and payment to either district.

Remember... the plants we sell are bare rootstock. Your order will come bundled together with all the roots wrapped in moist packing. While the plant is smaller, the root system is very well developed. The good root system is most important to minimize transplant shock. Once you pick them up, they should be planted within a short time.

Buffer Bundles -- We didn't put packaged buffer bundles together this year.

Take the time to select your own buffer plants based on your own particular needs. We have identified plants that would work best for riparian or waterway buffers [Bfr]. We have also tried to identify plants that will provide better food sources for wildlife or benefit pollinators like bees or butterflies. We hope it helps you select the types of plants you are looking for. Remember, we only have a brief space for plant descriptions. Go online, check a good plant book, contact a local nursery or the UMaine Extension office.

A vegetative buffer that is 25-30' long and 4-8' wide should include 12-20 plants. If you want it thicker right away, you may need more. If you are patient about letting it "fill in" then the 12-20 plants are an adequate start. Remember to consider soils, water and sun needs of the plants.

Anything over 2-3 days requires some extra attention on your part (suggestions are available). It is possible, but not recommended to delay planting for a couple weeks.

Mar. 19th deadline for orders.

Before selecting and purchasing plants it is important to know whether or not they are likely to survive. The Kennebec "Plant Hardiness" zones are 4 and 5 with the average minimum temperatures ranging from -15° to -20°. Somerset is mostly zone 4 with minimum temperatures from -20 to -25. While all the plants we offer are expected to survive in areas down to these temperatures; your area may be special. Talk to a neighbor who gardens, Cooperative Extension, a local nursery, or a greenhouse that deals in perennial plants. For a detailed map and more information on the Plant Hardiness Zones of Maine you may want to visit a gardening center, contact your Cooperative Extension office and ask for bulletin #2242, or go to their website at www.umext.maine.edu/onlinepubs/PDFpubs/2242.pdf. Or call us and we can send you one.

Note the earlier pick-up date!!!!

All plants are from Fedco in Clinton, ME. Many are grown by Maine growers (marked by an **ME** in their plant description) and have been selected to provide the best chances of survival. Remember: consider the growing conditions in the site where you plant. Consider the soils, wind exposure, direct sun, the surrounding plants and the conditions needed to be healthy and hardy. Your attention to these factors has the greatest impact on your plant's survival. We can only do so much to protect and care for the plants. **You** are most in control of the results.

When you pick up your plants on **Saturday, April 24th**, you can purchase other items too. We try to have bags of compost and advice from staff and volunteers. Planting instructions and other materials will be available.
