### FRUIT TREES & OTHER EDIBLES

Apples, plums, & highbush blueberries need 2 varieties for pollination!! It is recommended for pears.

- 0121 apple: Canadian Strawberry \$23** 3½-6', ME Z4-5 Superb-tasting dessert apple; very good cider; perfectly ripe at end of September.
- 0386 apple: Honeycrisp \$24** 3½-6' ME Z3-4 Mottled striped red over yellow. Described as "explosively crisp". Annual bearing w/ harvest in early fall through October. This is one of the new favorites. You may have tried it at the Ag Trade Show.
- 0743 apple; Priscilla \$23** 3½-6' ME Z4-7 One of the best. Crisp sweet flavored dark red fruit. Good dessert apple. Blooms mid season. Also used for cider.
- 1130 apple: Wealthy \$23** 3½-6' ME Z3-4 ME Native. One of the best. Tender, very juicy fall apple. Blooms early.
- 1293 cider apple: Foxwhelp \$23** 3½-6' ME Z4-6 Large, ribbed fruit, big as a Cortland; some say bitter, but makes "passable" pie. Very juicy & tart. Not bad as an "eating apple".
- 1620 pear: Summercrisp \$23** 3½ to 6', Z3 Large very sweet green skinned fruit ripens in August. Medium sized
- 1910 cherry: Stella Sweet \$23** 3½-6', Z4-5 Self pollinating large black-skinned fruit. Expected hardy in central Maine.
- 1930 pie cherry: Galaxy \$23 3½-6' ME Z3 Self-pollinating large dark red fruit. Expected to bear heavy crops. Small tree.
- 2010 peach: Reliance \$23** 3½-6' ME Z4-5 to the cold side. Considered the hardiest peach. Bright yellow flesh. Bears large crops at an early age. This is the type that had such heavy crops in the past few years.
- 2085 hybrid plum: Purple Heart \$23** 3½ - 6', ME Z4-6 Med-size fruit-full sweet flavor-the most delicious. Late summer on relatively small tree.
- 2260 blueberries: Lowbush \$12** Z2 Considered by many the only "true" blueberry. Woodsy dry poor acid soil is needed. Also a good ground cover. 2 yr. transplants. **Bfr Dry**
- 2285 blueberries: Blueray \$12** 12-30", Z4 Regarded as best tasting highbush. Grows to 4-6' bush.
- 2310 blueberries: Jersey \$12** 12-30", ME Z4 Med-Lg dark berries, loose clusters. Grows to 5-7' & hardy.
- 2512 grape: Somerset Seedless \$11** 1-2 yr vines Z4 Very early and easy to grow. Medium sized loose clusters with small orange-red fruit. May be hardiest of seedless variety.
- 2562 raspberry: Anne bndl of 10/ \$21** Z4 Everbearing tall, rangey, yellow early fruit
- 2660 raspberry: Killarney bndl of 10/\$21** Z3 Summer bearing early season very hardy on sturdy 4' canes
- 2751 blackberry: Nelson's bndl of 3/\$18** ME Z3-4 Tall, sturdy, exceptionally hardy. Fruit is moderately large, juicy, true blackberry taste.
- 2787 strawberry: Seascape bndl of 50/\$15** Z4 Everbearing with medium sized fruit with very long season
- 2877 asparagus-like: Good King Henry single plug/\$10** Z3 clumping perennial, mild, edible leaves, shoots, buds. Also called 'Poor man's Asparagus'.
- 2880 rhubarb: McDonald 2/\$16** Z3 Extremely vigorous. Used for pies, wine, sauce, bread, and juice.
- 2886 Skirret \$16** Z4 Grows to 3-6'. Carrot family-cross between parsley, parsnips, carrot & chestnut. Either divide or let part go to seed for propagation.
- 2892 Stevens American Cranberry bndl of 10/\$18** ME Z2 Large deep red fruit on vigorous vines. Require light acid soil. One clump will fill 5' x 5' bed. **wid Bfr**
- 2938 Juneberry/Shadbush \$14** 2-4' Z3 Grows 6-12' Canadian Shadbush is a compact shrub. Excellent foliage & berry production. Large fragrant white flowers in early spring. Prefers slightly acidic soils, tolerates partial shade, salt, pollution; not standing water. **wid Bfr**
- 2948 Apple Serviceberry \$15** Z4 Multi-stemmed shrub up to 20'. Showy bloom in spring, sweet fruit **wid**
- 3030 hops: Cascade pkg of 3/\$16** Z3 Fragrantly aromatic with low bittering value. Buttery cones. Needs well drained soil.
- 3070 Western Sandcherry \$12** 12-18" Z3 White flowers in spring; black, juicy plums suitable for pies, jellies
- 3171 sweet elderberry: Adams \$15** 12-14", Z3 Large, productive bush; large berries, fruit clusters See below for 2<sup>nd</sup> variety needed for pollination. **wid Bfr**
- 3179 sweet elderberry: York \$15** 12-15", ME Z3 Largest fruited & heaviest-bearing -year-round shrub **wid Bfr**
- 3238 Regal lingonberry \$12** ME Z3 Vigorous spreading groundcover with bright red fruit. Similar conditions as low bush blueberries. **wid**
- 3245 Highbush Cranberry: Wentworth \$11** 6-18" Z2 White flowers in May. Red-orange berries in late summer. Good bird food but also used for preserves. Bright lime green leaves. Plant grows to 8-12'. Prefers rich well drained soils. **wid**

Note symbols to help select wild-life and buffer plants more easily.

## EVERGREEN & DECIDUOUS SHADE TREES

- 3270 Balsam Fir** **bndl of 5/\$14** 9-18", ME Z3 The fragrant branches and needles of this tree are used in wreaths, balsam pillows and potpourri. Grows 45 - 75' ; prefers well-drained, moist acid soils. Avoid roadside planting.
- 3400 Norway Spruce** **bndl of 5/\$14** 12-24" **ME Z2** Fast growing to 80'. Wide-spreading upright with graceful long branches that often reach to the ground. Showy 4-6" cones.
- 3420 Colorado Blue Spruce** **bndl of 5/\$14** ME Z2 9-18" This tree grows 30-60' and can be used as a screen. Does not tolerate wet soils. Blue hue won't appear for several years. Improve blue color by adding nitrogen in the spring.
- 3590 Arborvitae (E. White Cedar)** **bndl of 5/\$14** 9-15", ME Z2 This narrow tree grows 20'- 60'. Arborvitae thrives in rich moist & marshy soils. Good for screens & hedges but very slow growing and deer like it. **Bfr**
- 3990 Sugar Maple** **\$16** 4-6', ME Z3 Largest of the maples native to Maine, and is valued for its shade, syrup and lumber. Shade tolerant. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Sensitive to salt and air pollutions, not a good city tree.
- 4016 Paper/White Birch** **\$16** 4-6', Z2 Med.-sized tree w/white peeling bark; sap makes good syrup.
- 4046 Katsuratree** **\$15** 2-3', ME Z4 Grows to 50'. Multi-trunked, wide-spreading form; heart-shaped leaves, reddish-purple becomes bluish-green then apricot-yellow in fall.
- 4106 Carpathian Walnut** **\$7** 6-12" Z4-5 Grows to 60'. Known as English Walnut; massive limbs dark green leaves; cabinet & veneer wood; tropical looking blue-green leaves.
- 4114 Tuliptree** **\$13** 3-5' Z4-5 Grows to 90'. Ornamental shade tree; 6-petaled, light yellow flower; golden yellow in fall
- 4150 Swamp White Oak** **\$14** 2-3', ME Z3 Grows to 60'. Massive shade tree, lower drooping branches, large acorns attractive to wildlife.
- 4191 Britzensis Coral Bark Willow** **\$11** 2-3', ME Z2 Fast growing, shrubby with "coral-red" bark. Likes water. This is a great winter plant in the snowy landscape. **Bfr Wt**
- 4207 Littleleaf Linden** **\$13** 12-18" ME Z3 Great shade tree with balanced shape. Fragrant yellowish flowers attract bees.
- 4230 Striped Maple** **\$11** 2-3', ME Z3 Also called Moosewood Maple. Very large leaves; called striped because of green & white stiped bark **wid**
- 4255 Pagoda Dogwood** **\$13** 18-36", ME Z3 Small tree with tiers of multi-stemmed branches. Fragrant white 2-3" flower clusters in late spring. In midsummer the immature olive berries ripen to dark blue. Fairly tolerant of sun and soil conditions. **Bfr**

## SHRUBS

- 4649 flowering crab: Kiehm's Improved Bechtel** **\$23** 3½-6', ME Z4 Rose-like double blooms-so fragrant cars will stop along the road in awe. Tree grows to 20' x 20'. **wid**
- 4659 flowering crab: Louisa** **\$23** 3½-6', ME Z4 Weeping form. Rose-colored buds open to pink flowers. Branches hang loosely to ground. **wid**
- 4761 flowering crab: Red Swan** **\$23** 3½-6', ME Z4 Mop-topped weeping form; reddish pink buds; white flowers; masses of bright red fruit. **wif**
- 4927 Fragrant Abelia** **\$13** 12-16" ME Z4 Showy fragrant pink tubular white centered flowers. Best as a specimen or hedge planting. Blooms in late spring. As fragrant as hyacinth. Glossy green foliage turns orange red in fall. Full sun to partial shade. Prune after flowering. **wid**
- 4961 Red Chokeberry** **\$11** 12-18", ME Z4 Upright multi-stemmed form makes a good landscape shrub. Small white flowers in clusters. Dark green foliage turns crimson in fall. Grows to 6-10'. **wid Bfr**
- 4968 Black Chokeberry** **\$11** 12-18" ME Z3 Compact rounded form. White blooms in late spring. Green foliage turns to wine-red foliage in fall. Produces black berries. Grows to 4-6' and is adaptable to location. **wid Bfr**
- 4990 Bicolor Butterfly Bush** **\$13** ME Z4 Arching shrub w/4-6" fragrant flowers guaranteed to attract butterflies, bees & hummingbirds. Reblooms. **wid**
- 5027 Siberian Peashrub** **\$10** 24-30" ME Z2 Delicate yellow spring flowers followed by golden pods. Pods and peas are edible. Easy to grow.
- 5049 Buttonbush** **\$11** 10-12", ME Z4 Loose rounded branchy shrub that likes it moist. Very interesting round "flowers" that generate seeds eaten by birds in the fall. Mine finally bloomed in '06' and were fascinating and long lasting. **wid Bfr**
- 5069 Ruby Spice Summersweet** **\$16** 1-2' ME Z3 Red buds & beautiful spires of heavenly scented deep pink flowers 6 weeks in midsummer.
- 5086 Indigo Silky Dogwood** **\$12** ME Z4-5 12-18" Multi-stemmed grows to 8'. Yellow-white flowers on purple stems. Good along streams or wetlands. **Bfr**
- 5091 Cardinal Redosier dogwood** **\$13** ME Z2 2-4' Shrub spreads freely; forms masses & borders Bright red winter stems. Excellent for erosion control.
- 5142 forsythia; Northern Gold** **\$12** 2-3' ME Z3 Tough plant, so it blooms above the snow line. Golden-yellow flowers on 6-8' plant. **Bfr**

- 5172 hydrangea: Endless Summer \$16** Z4 In acidic soils this is the blue flowering variety blooms on old and new wood. Grows to 3-4'.
- 5188 Inkberry \$12** ME Z4 Medium sized evergreen shrub. Small white flowers in spring; black berries in fall; good for hedges; low maintenance. **Wld**
- 5197 winterberry: Winter Red \$12** 12-18", ME Z4 7-8' dense compact female holly. Profuse red berries keep color all winter. Excellent for wildlife. Prefers wet soils but will tolerate dry conditions. A great buffer. See male pollinator next. A great buffer! See male pollinator next. **Wld Bfr Wet**
- 5201 winterberry: Southern Gentleman \$12** 12-18", ME Z4 Male selection to pollinate female winterberry. Grows to 6'. **Bfr Wet**
- 5204 Henry's Garnet Virginia Sweetspire \$12** ME Z4-5 10-12" Spreading shrub with fragrant white flowers in early summer. Good reddish-purple fall color. Likes moist or wet areas though tolerates drought. **Bfr, Wt, Dry**
- 5210 Beautybush \$12** 12-18", ME Z4 Fast growing multi-stemmed shrub needs room to grow. Small pink trumpet-like flowers in June. **Bfr**
- 5215 Spicebush \$12** 12-18", Z4 Large, rounded, multi-stemmed native flowering shrub with lemony-spicy scent. **Wld**
- 5240 Bayberry \$12** 12-18", Z2-3 Rounded semi-evergreen and salt-tolerant. Adaptable to various soils. Good mass planting. Common on the coast. Unsexed plants. Grows to 5-9'. Good wildlife and buffer plant. **Wld Bfr**
- 5309 McKay White Potentilla \$11** 18-24" ME Z2 Shrub can grow to be one of largest potentillas
- 5350 Rosa Rugosa/Beach Rose bndl of 3/\$17** 2-3' 2 yr. transplants, ME Z2 Vigorous spreading shrub, 4-6' tall. Fragrant flowers result in large red edible rose hips. Prune to control size. Likes full sun and drained soil but is tolerant. **Bfr**
- 5359 White Rugosa Rose single/\$12** ME Z2-3 Rugged; large, spreading shrub; pink bus, white, single flower, large, orange hips; Scarlet fall foliage
- 5397 Cuthbert Grant rose \$12** Z3 Large, fragrant, deep, intense, velvety red roses in clusters of 3-4
- 5562 Thimbleberry \$10** 2-4', ME Z3 Related to raspberry, attracts birds; rosy, purple fragrant blooms June-August; red berries **Bfr Wt**
- 5571 Dappled Willow \$10** 1-2', ME Z4 Highly ornamental. Pastel pink, white, green foliage; Slender, arching, radiating branches-turns red in winter **Bfr Wt**
- 5640 spirea: Dbl. Play Artist \$13** ME Z4 Low-growing shrub w/lacy foliage; resembles Japanese maples; white flowers spring, summer; Yellow & orange leaf color in fall. **Wld Bfr**
- 5716 Cutleaf Stephanandra \$12** ME Z4 Low-growing shrub w/lacy foliage; resembles Japanese maples; white flowers spring, summer; Yellow & orange leaf color in fall.
- 5720 White Snowberry \$11** 18-24" ME Z3 Long-stemmed shrub; multi-shaded blue & green foliage; pinkish flowers late spring, white berries following.
- 5785 lilac: James MacFarlane \$14** 2-3 yr plants, Z2 Pink single flowers; pleasant fragrance-long lasting; extremely hardy grows to 8'.
- 5856 lilac: Monge \$14** 2-3 yr plants Z3 Large, showy silvery red-purple blooms grows to 10-12'.
- 5935 viburnum: Nannyberry \$13** 1-2', ME Z2 Large clusters of fragrant white flowers in spring; purplish-red foliage in fall; edible berries. **Wld Bfr**

## OTHER PLANTS

- 6012 Fragrant/Ethiopian Gladiolus pkg of 20/\$7** tender summer bulb. Beautiful as cut flowers; 2" white flower w/purple center. 2' tall.
- 6112 Lily "Plum Tart" Glad Mix pkg of 20/\$8** tender summer bulb. Dark purple.
- 6182 Chater's Dbl. Hollyhock pkg of 3/\$8** Z3 Most extravagant fully double blooms in mixed colors
- 6202 Butterfly Weed pkg of 3/\$12** Z4-5 Tangerine flowers in midsummer to fall. May be difficult to establish but worth it. **Wld**
- 6222 aster; Marie Ballard pkg of 3/\$13** Z4 Pale blue double flowers-fancier than most. Grows 30-40" tall.
- 6232 astilbe; Visions pkg of 3/\$8** Z4 Raspberry-red plumes are fragrant. Brought tolerant grows to 14-16".
- 6262 Turtlehead pkg of 3/\$8** Z4 Deep green foliage topped by large bright pink flowers shaped very much like a turtle's head. grows to 2-3'.
- 6272 Lily of the Valley pkg of 10/\$8** Z2 Easy to grow; excellent ground cover; bell-shaped flowers.
- 6302 bleeding heart; Old Fashioned pkg of 3/\$9** Z3 Prefers room to spread out-blooms w/tulips; heart-shaped pink flowers Grows to 30-36". **Bfr**
- 6322 digitalis: Strawberry Foxglove pkg of 3/\$13** Z3 1/2" bell-shaped strawberry-rose flowers w/white--spotted throats hang on 3-4' spires. **Bfr**
- 6362 fern: Japanese Painted pkg of 2/\$13** Z3 Decorative but rugged fern. Soft grey-green with wine-red veins. Gets 8-18". **Bfr**
- 6402 fern: Royal pkg of 3/\$12** Z3 One of showiest garden ferns; attains giant proportions. Can grow to 9' wide. Light green fronds can be 3' long. **Bfr**
- 6412 Arizona Sun Gallardia 3/\$9** Z3 Loves heat/full sun; large, fiery-orange-red petals. Grows to 1'.

- 6432 hellebore: Royal Heritage 2/\$13** Z4 Blooms in winter, early spring; Variety of flower colors; 2-3" blooms. Is dormant in summer. All parts of plant are poisonous.
- Daylily ME** Z2-3 early blooms to midseason **Bfr**
  - **6452 Charles Johnson pkg of 3/\$12** Large 5-6" flowers; red tinged w/golden throat
  - **6462 Houdini pkg of 3/\$12** Large, 5-6" flowers; purple, yellow throat. Late season.
- 6491 Plum Crazy rose mallow pkg of 1/\$9** Z4 Hibiscus; late spring; purple leaves, plum flowers-up to 10" across-grows like crazy.
- Hosta** Z3 Bold foliage will grow in mounds or clumps. Flowers appear on tall stalks. **Bfr**
  - **6502 Guacamole pkg of 3/\$11** Pale lavender flowers, fragrant, but leaves are main attraction; large w/ dark green edging. 20-24" tall.
  - **6532 Frances Williams pkg of 3/\$9** Blue-green interior & golden-yellow edges; white flowers 36" tall.
- 6562 lavender: Munstead pkg of 3/\$13** 12-18", Z4 Lavender-blue spires with 15-18" spires. Spreading, aromatic likes full sun & good drainage.
- 6652 bee balm: Coral Reef pkg of 3/\$14** Z3 Large pink blooms with coral to 5' tall. Bees and butterflies love them. **Wld**
- 6711 peony Myra McRae pkg of 1/\$15** ME Z3 Cotton-candy colored big blooms grows on 4' plants. Blooms mid to late season.
- 6772 Balloon Flower pkg of 3/\$8** Z3 Buds swell like balloons before they bust into bell-like single violet-blue flowers. Good for cutting. One of the last perennials to emerge in spring so be careful not to disrupt or plant over Z3.
- 6782 Solomon's Seal pkg of 3/\$10** ME Z3 Forms clumps of 3' long fronds with green-white flowers. Likes shade and moisture. Sturdy plant, nursery grown. **Bfr, Wt**
- 6792 'Mrs Moon' Lungwort pkg of 2/\$9** Z3 Early season woodland perennial. Magenta buds open to bright blue flowers. Needs shade and will spread.
- 6842 Blue Spiderwort pkg of 3/\$9** Z3 Grows in clumps of grass-like leaves. Another woodland perennial likes the shade and will tolerate damp. **Bfr Wt**
- 6872 Caribbean Crush pkg of 2/\$8** Z5 needs protection. 40" flower spikes in multiple colors. Likes full sun.
- 6932 Purple Coneflower pkg of 2/\$13** ME Z3 certified organic Flowers attract butterflies and helpful insects. Vigorous 30-48" plant likes full sun and sandy loam. **Wld**
- 7022 Blue Vervain verbena pkg of 2/\$8** ME Z3 6' tall flower spikes with tiny purple-blue flowers whorled around the spikes. Needs full sun.
- 7510 Agri-gel ½ oz. packet \$3** Crystals adhere to plant roots, absorb and hold water, reducing transplant shock. Non-toxic. Single packet mixed with water will treat up to 100 cane plants or 50 trees and shrubs.

## 2011 tree and shrub sale

The Kennebec and Somerset County Soil & Water Conservation Districts combined sale allows you to pick your order up at different locations. **Please make it clear what location you want to use for picking up your order, so your plants are at the right one.** Select the location that works best for you. Questions? Contact either of the districts. You may send or drop off your order form and payment to either district.

Buffer Plants -- Particularly for you shorefront land owners. Take the time to select your own buffer plants based on your own particular needs. We have identified plants that would work best for riparian or waterway buffers [Bfr]. We have also tried to identify plants that will provide better food sources for wildlife or benefit pollinators like bees or butterflies. We hope it helps you select the types of plants you are looking for. Go online, check a good plant book, contact a local nursery or the UMaine Extension office.

A vegetative buffer that is 25-30' long and 4-8' wide should include 12-20 plants. If you want it thicker right away, you may need more. If you are patient about letting it "fill in" then the 12-20 plants are an adequate start. Remember; consider soils, water and sun needs of the plants.

The plants we sell are bare rootstock. Your order will come bundled together with all the roots wrapped in moist packing. While the plant is smaller, the root system is very well developed. The good root system is most important to minimize transplant shock. Once you pick them up, they should be planted within a short time. Anything over 2-3 days requires some extra attention on your part (suggestions are available). It is possible, but not recommended to delay planting for a couple weeks.

Before selecting and purchasing plants it is important to know whether or not they are likely to survive. The Kennebec "Plant Hardiness" zones are 4 and 5 with the average minimum temperatures ranging from -15° to -20°. Somerset is mostly zone 4 with minimum temperatures from -20 to -25. While all the plants we offer are expected to survive in areas down to these temperatures; your area may be special. Talk to a neighbor who gardens, Cooperative Extension, a local nursery, or a greenhouse that deals in perennial plants. For a detailed map and more information on the Plant Hardiness Zones of Maine you may want to visit a gardening center, contact your Cooperative Extension office and ask for bulletin #2242, or go to their website at [www.umext.maine.edu/onlinepubs/PDFpubs/2242.pdf](http://www.umext.maine.edu/onlinepubs/PDFpubs/2242.pdf). Or call us and we can send you one.

All plants are from Fedco in Clinton, ME. Many are grown by Maine growers (marked by an **ME** in their plant description) and have been selected to provide the best chances of survival. Remember: consider the growing conditions in the site where you plant. Consider the soils, wind exposure, direct sun, the surrounding plants and the conditions needed to be healthy and hardy. Your attention to these factors has the greatest impact on your plant's survival. We can only do so much to protect and care for the plants. **You** are most in control of the results.

Note the pick-up date!!!!

When you pick up your plants on **Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>**, you can purchase other items too. We try to have bags of compost and advice from staff and volunteers. Planting instructions and other materials will be available.
